☐ October 2010

DepEd officially announced K to 12, released its K to 12 Discussion Paper and invited CEAP to the K to 12 Steering Committee. CEAP representatives joined the K to 12 TWGs.

☐ November 2010 – February 2011

CEAP, together, with COCOPEA conducted regional consultations on the proposed K to 12 program. The terminal report was submitted to DepEd outlining issues, concerns and recommendations of the private education sector on the program.

☐ February 2011

The CEAP National Advocacy Commission convened a roundtable discussion with key legislators and presented the draft K to 12 bill extending the basic education cycle from 10 to 12 years.



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☐ February – August 2011

CEAP regional assemblies and commission/committee meetings and assemblies included the K to 12 program in the priority issues discussed.

☐ July 2011
